She has blazed the trail as one of the first African American stuntwomen in Hollywood and the first African American professional female surfer to compete on the ASP/WQS tour. She has been involved in numerous volunteer projects mentoring at-risk youth and the Wounded Warriors into empowerment through extreme sports, including surfing, snowboarding, and therapy utilizing dogs and political activism.
